## GOAL

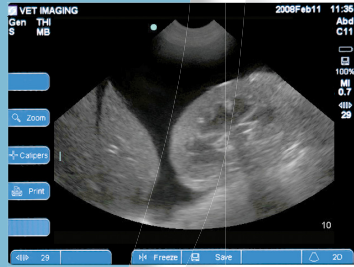
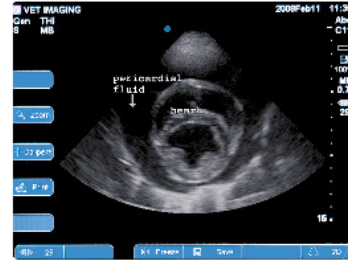
To provide veterinarians with the knowledge to accurately identify, stabilize, and treat small animals that present for emergency/critical care conditions using ultrasound as a diagnostic aid.

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

**Objective:** The candidate will learn ultrasound imaging for the management of abdominal emergencies, thoracic emergencies (including both cardiac and non-cardiac emergencies), and the stabilization of emergency patients.

**Participants:** This course is offered to small animal veterinarians of all ultrasound, radiology, and emergency skill levels who wish to further their knowledge in emergency medicine imaging and patient stabilization.

**Course Information:** Ultrasound in Emergency Situations is a two-day course that is a multimodal, multidisciplinary course taught by a combined team of a board certified cardiologist, a board certified critical care specialist and a board certified radiologist. The course will utilize didactic lectures in the morning followed by hands-on ultrasound wet labs that include both dogs and cats in the afternoon. This portion will be taught by imaging professionals who are adept in both cardiac and abdominal ultrasounds. The ultrasound wet labs will utilize up to seven workstations with a maximum of three participants per station to offer significant hands-on training time and one-on-one attention for each participant. Each course is limited to a maximum of 21 participants.



## INSTRUCTORS

**Dr. Seth Wallack** received his veterinary degree from the University of California, Davis. He then completed his small animal internship in general medicine and surgery at the Veterinary Specialty Hospital in San Diego. He completed a four-year radiology residency

at UC Davis. Dr. Wallack is board certified in radiology and has a special interest in MRI, small animal ultrasound, and exotic animal radiography.

**Dr. Sharon M. Huston** is a board certified veterinary cardiologist specializing in the treatment of heart disease in dogs and cats. Through her practice, San Diego Veterinary Cardiology, Dr. Huston is available for cardiac consultations at the VCA Emergency Animal Hospital & Referral Center, located in San Diego.

Dr. Huston also has the honor of providing cardiology services to the U.S. Navy Marine Mammal Program and is the consulting cardiologist for The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA). Dr. Huston is an active participant in continuing education; she participates in training veterinary students from The College of Veterinary Medicine at Western University in Pomona and veterinary schools across the country.

**Dr. Kathryn Crump** graduated with her veterinary degree from Massey University in New Zealand in 2002. She then moved back to her home city of Auckland to work in a small animal clinic for two years, gaining valuable experience in general practice. Through the internship and residency matching program, Dr. Crump relocated to America in 2004 where she completed a one year internship at Oklahoma State University.

In 2005, Dr. Crump joined the staff at Advanced Critical Care & Internal Medicine as an emergency doctor. She joined ACCIM's residency program in emergency and critical care in 2006, and passed the board exams in 2009 to become a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care.
